

Student Body Diversity

The Higher Education Act, as amended by the Higher Education Opportunity Act of 2008, requires that all postsecondary education institutions participating in Title IV, HEA financial aid programs make available to current and prospective students information regarding student body diversity. Information includes the percentage of full-time students who (1) are male, (2) are female, (3) identify with a major racial/ethnic group, and (4) are recipients of a Federal Pell grant. The most recent data available on Holyoke Community College's student body diversity appears below.
