## **HCC** to present 'Quiero Volver,' an original multimedia opera

HOLYOKE - The Community College Public Humanities Center at Holyoke Community College will present "Quiero Volver: A Xiacanx Ritual Opera," Friday, Oct. 20, at 7 p.m. in HCC's Leslie

Phillips Theater.

Quiero Volver," which in Spanish means "I want to return," is a 60-minute multimedia performance and theatrical reading that features original music, poetry and documentary video by Northampton resident Diana Alvarez, a guitarist, vocalist and performance artist who created the show as part of her PhD dissertation at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, where she is in the Electronic Arts program.

"A small ensemble of five performers will read and perform sonic rituals, meditations, and poems for the audience," said Alvarez. "Their performances will be interwoven with my own original songs and documentary footage from my dissertation

Alvarez previously performed at HCC earlier this year in "Latinas con Pluma," a musical and theatrical production of dramatic readings created by HCC theater


professor Patricia Sandoval, who serves as artistic director for "Quiero Volver."

"This opera has been many years in the making as I meditated on the constant use of the word 'volver' in Mexican music

and Spanish-language songs in general," said Alvarez, who is originally from Corpus Christi, Texas.

She said she developed an interpretation of the word that is, in part, a meditation on grief.

"Xiacanx people -Mexican Americans — and people of color as a whole have many reasons to grieve," she said. "We experience the longstanding effects of racism, colonization, and exploitation on a daily basis. The goal of my piece is to create a space to honor those most affected by these injustices and to share with the audience our rituals of healing and
