2017 as a safe, fun and early alternative to traditional trick-or-treating on Halloween night. Rather than going door to door seeking Halloween treats, children go "trunk to trunk" to collect their candy, visiting cars decorated with seasonal themes and familiar stories and characters.

The event is free and open to the public. Children must be accompanied by an adult.

In the event of rain, Trunk or Treat will be held in the hallways and classrooms on the first floor of the Donahue and Frost buildings.

Last year, more than 20 HCC clubs and departments, area businesses and community groups sponsored cars and decorated them for the event. Prizes are awarded to vehicle sponsors in various categories like best executed theme, scariest trunk, best costumes and most original.
