Communication - Priority #1: Stay informed! Login to all services at MyHCC, login Instructions www.hcc.edu/Documents/IT/login instructions student.pdf:

- Email & Online Services HCC email is used for all communication and Online Services gives you access to e-billing and payment plans, financial aid status and financial aid consent to electronic communication, insurance waiver, registration, advisor, DegreeWorks, grades, and student records. Be sure to check it regularly!

Admission

- College Placement Test: is a computerized assessment of basic math, reading, and writing, and is required. Testing takes approximately two hours in the Assessment Center (FR 271) 413-552-2055.
- **Student ID card:** Bring your printed schedule and license (or state issued picture ID) to get your HCC Student ID Card in the Assessment Center (FR 271) 413-552-2055.



Immunization Records: All full-time students(regardless of age) are required by MA State
Law (Chap. 76, Sect. 15C) to submit complete documentation of their immunization records
within 30 days of registration. Please ask your health care provider for a copy of any shot
records in your file and submit to Health Services www.hcc.edu/student-services/healthservices (FR 105) or fax 413-552-2121.

Advising & Registration

Advising Center provides all aspects of academic advising to new, current, and returning students. Advisors will assist you with registration of classes and educational planning. Pay for College

- Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA): submit electronically www.fafsa.ed.gov/; correct your FAFSA; and check your status with HCC Federal School Code #002170.
- Pay Your Bill: To make payments to your account login to My Online
 Services www.hcc.edu/myhcc and you can access eRefund/eBill/Payments/Payment
 Plans or go to the Student Accounts Office (FR 201) or call (413) 552-2101.
- College Store: To purchase or rent books you will need your class schedule and your HCC student ID card and form of payment: cash, check, charge, or Financial Aid Book advance or to purchase your books at the college store www.hcc.edu/campus-life/bookstore or online www.ehccbookstore.com/home.aspx: Location: Campus Center 1st floor, (413) 552-2521.

Health Insurance

• Waive Health Insurance: Health insurance fees may be waived directly with Gallagher Student Health & Special Risk www.gallagherkoster.com/students/user-login.php?idField=1200, if the student has comparable coverage through personal, parental, or spousal insurance (including qualified coverage through the Massachusetts Health Connector Benefit Plan or MassHealth, with the exception of certain MassHealth programs). Free health care (treatment provided at a local hospital or clinic) is not considered comparable coverage. If you have difficulty logging in to waive your health insurance, call Gallagher Student Health & Special Risk customer service at (617) 328-2303.

HCC Photo ID



- Student ID card: Students are expected to carry their ID when on campus. Cards are issued after placement testing (FR 271) or registration (FR 273). Students use ID cards to access computer labs, the library, the Bartley Center for Athletics and Recreation, to attend college-sponsored events, and to use PVTA services and for all college transactions. There is a replacement fee of \$7, which can be made at Student Accounts (FR 201). Always carry your ID!
- **Library Card:** Bring your HCC Student ID card to the library to receive a barcode, which will allow you access to library resources. (DON 202), (413) 552-2372.

Transportation

- PVTA Bus Pass: You'll need your HCC Student ID card to receive your bus pass; and both cards (HCC ID and bus pass) are needed to use the PVTA service for free. Student Accounts Office (FR 201), (413) 552-2101.
- **PVTA Bus Schedules:** PVTA is an independent contractor, so for scheduling questions contact: PVTA www.pvta.com/schedules.php (413) 781-7882.
- Parking Registrations: All vehicles need to have an HCC parking sticker by the first week
 of classes and students must be aware of the parking rules and regulations
 www.hcc.edu/about-hcc/visit-hcc/parking-at-hcc/parking-regulations. We issue tickets and
 tow for violations. Take your HCC Student ID card and your vehicle registration to your New
 Student Orientation session or to Campus Police to receive a permanent parking sticker.

Stay on track!

- Advising: Meet with your academic advisor to discuss your program of study by asking
 questions that you may have regarding your course schedule, pace for completion of
 degree/certificate, and how you are doing with your grades. At your assigned orientation you
 will receive a card with your advisor's name. If you do not receive an advisor's name, you
 can access your advisor's name at MyHCC Online Services www.hcc.edu/myhcc or contact
 Academic Affairs (413) 552-2070.
- DegreeWorks is used for academic planning by students and advisors. It provides real-time
 information, such as advisor, degree, major requirements, GPA, course completion and
 grades; streamlines the graduation process; and provides intuitive web access to self-service
 capabilities at MyHCC Online Services www.hcc.edu/myhcc.
- **Transfer:** Meet with the transfer counselor early on to set a plan to transfer, because this plan will help you understand the requirements from the transfer institution, such as courses, GPA, and *MassTransfer* options. Contact: Mark Broadbent (413) 552-2498.
