Minecraft Construction (ages 8-12)

Students will work cooperatively in this virtual world and build nearly anything they can imagine, exploring the basics of design, planning, spatial reasoning, teamwork and leadership skills. **\$289**

An in-depth continuation of "Video Game Design" with more advanced and sophisticated concepts of 3D animation and game design will be taught with digital video production and web design techniques with students completing more professional products with greater features.
