- Apply for Admission to HCC! Create an account at www.hcc.edu/apply. Complete and submit your application. A decision letter or acceptance packet will be sent to you in the mail. Follow the steps sent to the email address you provided.
- Apply for Financial Aid. Create an FSA ID at https://fsaid.ed.gov. Next, go to https://fafsa.ed.gov to submit your financial aid application. HCC's school code is 002170. If you have already completed a FAFSA, please check on your application by logging in to Online Services at www.hcc.edu/mvhcc.
- Take the Placement Test. HCC uses the College Board Accuplacer test. Go to https://accuplacer.collegeboard.org/student/practice for practice tests and study guides. Select the "Classic" version. To schedule your test, go to www.hcc.edu/placement, or contact the Assessment Center at 413.552.2015 or email assessment@hcc.edu. This is also where you get your Student ID.

Register for classes. Meet with an advisor to develop your educational plan and schedule your classes. A career counselor can help you choose a major or provide career exploration. Walk into the Advising, Career & Transfer Center (ACT) or call 413.552.2722 to schedule your appointment.

Log in to Email & Online Services at www.hcc.edu/myhcc. HCC email is used for all communication. 



#### Credit Course Enrollment Information

#### **New and Re-Admit Students**

Students new to HCC and students who have been away from HCC for two or more semesters must apply for admission at hcc.edu/apply. All degree or certificate seeking students must take the placement test. HCC uses the College Board's Accuplacer test for placement into math and English. After you have completed the placement test, you will meet with an advisor to develop an educational plan and register for classes.

#### **Current Students**

Registration for current students begins March 21. Students may add and drop classes through September 7. If you have earned fewer than 12 college-level credits at HCC or your cumulative GPA is under 2.5, you must obtain a registration code from your advisor in order to register. HCC provides academic advising to all current students. To look up your advisor's name and contact information, login to Online Services at www.hcc.edu/myhcc. Students who have earned 12 or more credits at HCC and have a cumulative HCC GPA of 2.5 or higher may register, add and drop classes through Online Services or on campus without a registration code.

Students who plan to register for fewer than three classes per semester can complete the registration form on page 72 (intersession) and 74 (spring). If registering for Online courses only, go to hcc.edu/ online to complete the Online Course Registration Request form.

#### **COURSE CANCELLATION**

Low enrollment can necessitate course cancellation. HCC will attempt to notify students whose class has been cancelled and help them choose another course or obtain a refund. Completing your course registration as early as possible helps the college avoid cancelling classes.

If the college cancels a course, 100% of all tuition and fees are refunded.

# STUDENT ACCOUNT BALANCES AND PAST DUE BILLS

You must pay your bill by the due date listed on p. 9 (based on date of course enrollment) to avoid late fees. A hold will be placed on your account preventing you from enrolling in future semesters and/or obtain an official transcript until the balance is paid in full.

If a balance remains on your account, the balance will be referred to collection agencies where you will be charged legal fees, and collection company fees and costs. Collection costs can be as high as 40 percent of the past due unpaid balance. In addition to collection agencies, unpaid accounts will be referred to the Massachusetts Department of Revenue and reported to the Massachusetts Debt Intercept Program where state and federal payments due to the student, including state tax refunds, will be intercepted and transferred to Holyoke Community College until the student account balance is paid in full.

# Academic Information Academic Probation and Dismissal

Academic probation or dismissal for students is determined by the cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) and Quality Hours, as follows:

Below 9	No minimum
9 - 30	1.75
Above 30	2.0

**Probation:** The first time a student fails to earn the minimum required GPA as listed above, he/she will be placed on Academic Probation.

**Dismissal:** At the end of two semesters of probation, if the cumulative GPA remains below the minimum standard, the student will be dismissed. However, the student will not be dismissed if, during a probationary semester, he/she earns a GPA of 2.0 or better.

**Readmission:** A student dismissed because of the lack of academic progress may petition for readmission by contacting the Academic Affairs office 413.552.2770.

#### **Auditing a Course**

Auditing a course means attending but not being responsible for written work such as assignments and tests. Audited courses do not earn credits. If a course requires a prerequisite(s), student must provide evidence of meeting the prerequisite(s). To audit a course, complete an Audit Petition at the Student Records office at the time of registration or within the first week of the semester. The cost to audit a course is the same as enrolling for credit.

#### **Credit by Examination**

HCC offers College Level Examination Program (CLEP) testing, a national examination system administered by the College Entrance Board. #### **Dean's List**

Students of superior academic achievement are recognized through the Dean's List. Each time a student accumulates 12 credits, that student is placed on the Dean's List if his/her GPA is 3.2 or higher for that group of 12 credits. Each group of 12 credits is evaluated sequentially; no carryover of credits is allowed.

#### **Developmental Courses**

Courses numbered below 100 are developmental and are not applied toward degree requirements. Developmental course credits and grades are not included in credits earned and are not calculated into the Grade Point Average.

#### **Fresh Start Option**

Once in a lifetime, after a three-year minimum absence from HCC, a student with a Grade Point Average of less than 2.0 may elect Fresh Start. This eliminates the effect of all past course work from the GPA. Past HCC courses may be accepted into the Fresh Start program in accordance with the college's transfer credit policy. #### **Incomplete Grade**

The grade of "I" is given to a student who for good reason (e.g., illness) is unable to complete a major part of the work in a course. It may also be given at midsemester indicating that work has not been completed. The student has until mid-semester of the following semester to complete work for courses other than those that serve as a prerequisite for another course. Unless waived, prerequisite course requirements must be completed before the first day of the following semester/Intersession. A grade of "F" and 0.00 grade

When enrolling for a course with a prerequisite not taken at HCC, students will be responsible for presenting a college transcript which documents that the prerequisite has been met.

#### **Repeated Courses**

Students may repeat courses at HCC in an attempt to earn credit or improve their Grade Point Average. Credit may not be earned twice for a repeated course. All grades, including those in repeated courses, will appear on transcripts. The most recent grade will be included in the student's GPA calculation. The previously recorded grade will be excluded from the GPA, but will still appear on the student transcript.

Financial aid can only pay for one repeat of a previously passed course. This repeat policy applies even if you did not receive financial aid when enrolled in the course in the past.

#### **Transferring Credit Into HCC**

The college accepts transfer credit from other regionally accredited institutions of higher learning for courses which may be applied to your declared

program of study if the courses are similar in content to those offered here. When transfer credit is awarded, the grades earned are not averaged into your Holyoke Community College GPA. Credit is granted for courses carrying a grade of C- or better, regardless of the cumulative GPA at the previous institution. The college also grants credit for military courses which meet guidelines issued by the American Council on Education (ACE). For foreign transcripts, the college will provide you with a list of agencies that evaluate foreign credentials for a fee; the credit award is based on the evaluation which the college receives directly from the agency and also on the applicability of the course work to your program. The limit of transfer credit from all sources, including CLEP, is in accordance with the college's 30-credit residency requirement. However, you may request a waiver of this requirement by submitting a Request for Exception to Graduation form to the Office of the Vice President for Academic Affairs. Waivers are granted on a case-by-case basis by the Vice President for Academic Affairs.



#### **HON 206** Honors Colloquium: Health (In)Equity: The Good, the Bad and the Ugly in American Society [B] or [C] **6 Credits**

This course is an exploration of health (in)equity through a public health and medical anthropology perspective. Students will learn about how economics, race, gender and other social markers of difference impact health. They will work in the classroom and in the community to gain a deep understanding of health inequalities in the United States, and specifically in Holyoke and Springfield. How does your body know what time it is? How do your senses work at the cell level? Why do some people get cancer and others not? Why is there a range of human skin colors? Why are bacteria becoming resistant to antibiotics, and what can we do about that? Can renewable biofuels save the planet? Will gene-editing destroy humankind? This honors course provides a rigorous introduction to the living processes within cells by exploring the chemical and molecular basis of life in the context of these questions. Emphasis is placed on basic chemistry, biochemical reactions, cell structure and function, and molecular genetics. Students are expected to do assignments outside of class that require internet access. In the laboratory, students will carry out an original lab research project to discover new antibiotics. 3 class hours and 3 laboratory hours

## LC 104 Food for Thought 6 Credits

An introduction to the sciences of nutrition and psychology, and their applications to everyday life. Students will learn how to apply the logic of science to their own nutritional concerns, psychological processes, and behaviors. Nutrition topics include the six major nutrients: carbohydrates, fats, proteins, vitamins, minerals, and water, energy balance, weight control, the digestive process, nutrition fads, supplements, fiber, and disease as it relates to nutrition and fitness. Psychological topics include general principles of scientific investigation, the brain and neurological processes, learning, cognition and memory, development over the lifespan, stress, personality, attitudes, social interactions and social influence, and psychological disorders. Special attention will be paid to the bidirectional relationship between psychology and nutrition: the influence of psychological and social processes on eating behaviors, and of nutrition on psychological processes.

## LC 105 The Nature of New England

7 Credi

This Learning Community combines English 101 and The Natural History of New England, a lab science, for a seven-credit interdisciplinary course that fulfills two graduation requirements. In this course, we will explore the rich geologic history and the diverse natural flora and fauna of the region. New England possesses a great assortment of landforms and ecological systems in a relatively small geographic area. The geologic past included volcanoes, lava flows, collisions and divergences of continental plates, and most recently retreating glaciers. This newly renovated landscape made way for a succession of varied forest types and other ecosystems as the flora and fauna adapted to this newly warming and transformed environment. In both reading and field observations, we will learn about the geologic history of New England, natural and human disturbance, forest succession, and the resulting shifting mosaic of the biotic community. Students will reinforce their understanding of the science curriculum by writing academic essays, journaling, and creating multi-media projects. Students will read, analyze, and cite a range of nonfiction texts and will produce several formal essays totaling approximately 3,000 words. Field experiences require some walking over uneven terrain.

## LC 108 Can't Live with Them, Can't Live without Them: Chocolate, Sugar, and Coffee through History, Lit and Film 6 Credits

Chocolate, sugar, and coffee - once these three were rare, exotic luxury foods but now many consider them essentials in their daily diet. How did we get here? What does it mean? Using an interdisciplinary approach through History, Literature, and Film, we will explore the impact and meaning of these three commodities on cultures around the world and on the human body. These "drug foods" have played important roles in the history of industrial nations and the structuring of colonial and post-colonial societies in Africa, Latin America, and Asia. They provide us with a lively lens through which to observe current efforts toward sustainable development and the role of consumption patterns in sustainability. Both the production and consumption of chocolate, sugar, and coffee must be seen from historical, political, economic, geographical, and gendered perspectives, as we explore the arena of international trade, debates over appropriate agricultural technology, and the construction of national identity and taste. From the origins of these agricultural products, through their sale, industrial processing, advertising, resale, and consumption, we will trace the changing patterns of food use and their implications for different cultures, elites, corporations, and for international political and economic history. We will also explore the changing patterns of consumption today in America and the meanings that people attach to their use of chocolate, sugar, and coffee. From the history of the distinctive taste of milk chocolate to debates over sugar derived from cane, beets, corn, and other products to issues of Fair Trade and organic coffee, students will have an opportunity to develop their own interests and research questions.

This course uses the acclaimed HBO series as a semester-long case study to examine the dynamic relationship between capitalism and patriarchy. This includes an investigation of how the intersections of race, class, gender, politics, economics and culture impact women's lives as well as a critical examination of relevant policy solutions. ## LC 203 The Tranquil(ized) Fifties: Consensus and Dissensus in Mid-Century America (Honors)

6 Credits

In popular culture and some political discourse, the 1950s appear as a lost paradise of a decade, a time of peace and prosperity, a golden age from which American culture has fallen (through the divisive Sixties, the self-obsessed Seventies, and the go-go Eighties). Any serious examination of the period, though, reveals not the fact of tranquility so much as the act of tranquilizing as Cold War tensions roiled internationally and political and social unrest continually erupted in the domestic sphere. Studying fine art, literature, and mass entertainment from the 1950s, this course explores some key episodes of this dynamic of conformity and conflict, including the persecution of political dissent, rebellions against the dominant social order (especially along lines of generation, race, sex, and sexuality), anxieties over international relations and nuclear catastrophe, avant-garde experimentation in the arts, and attempts to re-establish or shore up cultural dominance. Work in such collections as the Smith College Museum of Art and the Rare Book Room figure prominently in

the syllabus. This course is part of a Learning Community at Holyoke Community College and of a Smith-HCC partnership. It will include HCC students as well as Smith students. In addition to its regular meeting time, the course includes a one-day-per-week session for viewing work at the museum and screening films and other media work.

Prerequisites: a 3.5 GPA after 30 hours of study and English 102 is preferred. Permission of the instructor is required.

#### LC 204 The Politics of Food (Honors)

6 Credits

Anthelme Brillat-Savarin, once wrote: "You are what you eat." Do you ever wonder where your food comes from? Or where your garbage ends up? As we face increasing global environmental concerns, especially concerns with food shortages and safety, people throughout the world are seeking answers that will bring our planet to a healthier, more sustainable condition. All environmental controversies involve ethical dilemmas. Should we develop communities or leave open space? Should food be distributed more equitably? What is a fair allocation of resources? How do we ensure clean air and water, and who should pay for it? Will the current agricultural practices provide both safe and healthy food, and sustain the planet? In this honors Learning Community we will explore these dilemmas as well as others and, more significantly, attempt to discern how the choices we make determine our existences and, perhaps more importantly, determine the lives of future generations, as well as the existence of the earth itself. "Land," as Aldo Leopold once wrote, "is a system of interdependent parts which should be regarded as a community and not a commodity." We will begin from Leopold's insight concerning the land that we rely upon to survive to explore various ecological philosophies and how these conceptual frameworks help us understand our natural place on our planet. 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
