- Apply for Admission to HCC! Create an account and apply at www.hcc.edu/apply. Follow the steps sent to the email address you provided.
- Apply for Financial Aid. Go to www.fafsa.gov to submit your financial aid application - it's free to apply! Priority deadline for Massachusetts is May 1. HCC's School Code is 002170.
- Course Level Placement. Students are required to show proof that they meet the eligibility requirements for courses they are interested in taking. Contact Admissions to learn how.
- Register for Classes. Meet with an advisor to schedule your classes. Contact the Advising, Career, & Transfer (ACT) Center or visit their website at www.hcc.edu/act.
- Log into Email and Online Services at www.hcc.edu/myhcc. Your HCC email will be the official mode of communication between the College and you.
- Pay Tuition and Mandatory Fees by the deadline printed on the back of your schedule or found in your Online Services.
- Order your Textbooks online at www.hcc.edu/bookstore. Order early to ensure delivery prior to the start of the semester!
- Attend Mandatory New Student Orientation (NSO) that will provide you with information to help you make a successful transition to HCC.






FAFSA Mobile App



What You Need to Know About HCC Online

We would like to invite you to join HCC Online. At HCC you can complete your entire degree online or you can choose to take some of your courses online. In order to take online courses, you should have basic computer skills and access to a computer with Internet.

Online courses are not self-paced. They follow the same academic calendar as on-campus courses. Students are expected to log in and start coursework the first day of classes. All of our online courses are a-synchronous, which means you don't have to meet at a predetermined time. You complete your coursework on your schedule. Each course outlines the attendance policy and participation requirements in the syllabus.

Where do I find my online class? All of our courses run in Moodle (https://moodle.hcc.edu). Moodle is an Digital Learning environment where you interact with your instructors and peers, and where you find the course materials, syllabi, assignments and readings, etc. You

can explore and familiarize yourself with Moodle in our Learn Moodle practice course.

Are Online Courses Easier? Not really. You should expect to complete the same amount of work as normally required in an oncampus course. For example, for a 3 credit class, you are expected to be online working at least 3 to 5 days a week.

Most courses require a textbook. Make sure you have your textbook for the first day of classes. A link to our virtual College Store is available in Moodle.

You may be taking your classes online, but you are never alone. All our academic support services are available to you: etutoring (online tutoring), library online services, academic advising, the help desk and MERC, which are students helping students.

We will read a variety of non-fiction texts and literature—from "Orange is the New Black", to poetry written by incarcerated women, to the play "Getting Out"--to discover what misconceptions we share about gender in our society and how it imprisons women—literally, emotionally and spiritually. In each of the texts we read, we will also consider the impact of the writer's voice on society and how having a voice and being heard helps women find their own personal freedom, whatever it may be. This course will also feature civic engagement work with a community-based organization called Voices From Inside that is dedicated to illuminating the experiences of incarcerated women.

LC 105 Skin Deep: How Real is Race? 7 Credits

The Human Race – what does that really mean? What is and is NOT "race"? A biological reality, a social construct, and/or something else? Health, education, employment, housing, and the environment are all social constructs that have been affected by attitudes and beliefs about perceived racial differences. In this course, we will explore the concept of "race" by examining its use in society and in science. We will learn about biological and genetic variation that evolved among humans, at the cellular, organism, and population levels, and apply that knowledge to the concept of race as it has been historically used and misused by social, religious, and political systems. We will also learn about the four major subdisciplines of anthropology, including physical/biological, cultural, linguistic, and archaeological, as they apply to the study of human race. For comparison, we will look at definitions of race used for non- anthropological organisms such as plants. Note that BIO101 does not count as a biology course for science majors.

LC 106 She Persisted: Exploring Women's Lives through History and Acting 6 Credits

Because I am a woman, I must make unusual efforts to succeed. If I fail, no one will say, "She doesn't have what it takes." They will say, "Women don't have what it takes." - Clare Boothe Luce Women's marches of 2017. Second Wave feminism. Rosie the Riveter. Surviving the Great Depression. The fight for the vote. Triangle Factory Fire. Anti-lynching campaigns. Slavery. Native American resistance. Throughout American History, women have persisted by negotiating the often oppressive political, social, economic, and cultural forces that shape their lives. Integrating the study of history and acting techniques, we will bring to life the stories of specific women in order to better understand the diversity of all women's experiences. We will explore the ways in which notions of gender differences have changed over time and how women both created and responded to shifting and contested cultural, political, and social roles. Some of the major themes include the differences among women in class, race, ethnicity, and sexuality, the construction of gender, women's roles in family and community, various movements for women's rights, women and reform, and women in the work force. Class format will include interactive discussion, critical reading and writing, improvisational techniques, and performances of monologues and scenes.

A history of American cities in the industrial era, this course will focus especially on the city of Holyoke as a site of industrialization, immigration, urban development, and deindustrialization. We will begin with a walking tour of Holyoke and an exploration of the making of a planned industrial city. We will then investigate the experience of several key immigrant groups – principally Irish, French Canadian, Polish, and Puerto Rican – using both primary and secondary historical sources, as well as fiction. Students will write several papers based on research in the archives of Wistariahurst Museum and the Public Library in Holyoke, and a final paper that explores in greater depth one of the topics addressed in the course. The course will include students from Amherst College and Holyoke Community College; enrollment is limited to ten students per institution.

LC 200 Reimagining Incarceration

6 Credits

There are currently over 2 million people living in prisons and jails across the United States – more incarcerated people per capita than any other country in the world. What is the carceral state and how do particular gendered and racialized bodies get caught up in its logics? How do gender, race, sexuality, and class shape systems of discipline, punishment, surveillance, and control? What is "anti-carceral feminism" and what are some of the abolitionist critiques of the prison industrial complex? This course approaches the issue of mass incarceration through the lens of feminist social justice theory, gender and sexuality studies, critical race theory and political economy. An intersectional and deeply interdisciplinary exploration of the carceral, the course draws on literature, memoir, film, history, the social sciences, art and popular media to interrogate and explore the many dimensions of mass incarceration in the US. Note: Meetings outside of scheduled class time are an integral part of the course.

This course is a survey of the political, economic, social, and cultural developments of the United States from the end of the Civil War until the present, including such topics as Reconstruction, industrialization, immigration, the Great Depression, the New Deal, the world wars, the Cold War, Vietnam and the Sixties. Obviously, one of my goals is for you to gain a broad understanding of significant events, diverse peoples (racial, gender, ethnic, and class groups), and ideas from our collective past. But that is only part of our mission. As we proceed, we will scrutinize and debate conflicting interpretations of each subject. In addition, we endeavor to reveal the connections between past and present, and thus demonstrate the relevancy of history to our own lives. Course objectives include:

HON 206 Ecosocialism or Ecocide? The Challenges of Environ Ethics and Politics in an Age of Eco Catastrophe 6 Credits

The multifaceted environmental crisis we see around us today, as perhaps exemplified most dramatically in global climate destabilization, results from capitalism's tendency to view the nonhuman natural world as a resource for the extraction of economic value and a repository to externalize production costs. This Honors Colloquium will pose a question equal to the crisis facing us and the rest of nature: Ecosocialism or Ecocide?

The alienation of nature and of human beings compels us to rethink the economic, social, political, cultural, and environmental norms of capitalist society. In order to propel this rethinking of the capitalist social formation, our inquiry will be informed by a variety of sources, including indigenous knowledges, ecofeminist critiques, classic works in political economy, and current scholarship in ecosocialist political ecology. Please join us as we explore both the contours of the planetary ecological crisis and various ecosocialist responses to it.

Einstein said that "reality is merely an illusion, albeit a very persistent one." If reality is an illusion, then . . . it isn't real, and if reality lurks within illusion, then how do we look for it? Just as Alice travels down the rabbit hole into Wonderland—a land of logical nonsense and deliberate contradictions—our colloquium will make a journey to examine the multiple dimensionality of life. Hidden below the surface of things, we'll discover ambiguity and double meanings everywhere. We'll have to pause and question our own preconceived ideas about reality, what we know, and how we know it, or whether we know anything at all. We may truly be confused at times, but as we persist we'll find ourselves arriving at another

dimension, one where new ways of seeing and understanding are possible. While Alice attends mad tea parties and quirky croquet games, we'll pause to marvel at the garden before us: perfectly ordered patterns and shapes, mirrors, and symmetry. We'll play in the garden for a while and then we'll meander to Flatland, a world bound to only two dimensions, and to Arcadia, where space and time travel are possible. Here, we'll stumble upon some intricate and eerily beautiful patterns named fractals and the self-symmetry they display. Oh, we'll also run into some chaos, but don't worry; we'll make it back okay—a bit wiser, perhaps, and with a different understanding of the beauty that surrounds us.



New and Re-Admit Students

Students new to HCC and students who have been away for two or more semesters must apply for admission at hcc.edu/apply. All degree or certificate seeking students are required to show proof that they meet the eligibility requirements for courses they are interested in taking. Students may do this by providing one or more of the following that apply to them: final high school transcript, AP math scores, AP English scores, SAT scores, GED results, or prior college transcripts. If you do not have those documents, you may also take the HCC Placement Tests in Math and English or provide College Board Accuplacer scores from an approved testing site. After providing proof of eligibility, you will meet with an advisor to register for classes.

Current Students

Registration for current students begins October 23. Students may add and drop classes through January 30, if you have earned fewer than 12 college-level credits at HCC or your cumulative GPA is under 2.5, you must obtain a registration code from your assigned advisor in order to register. HCC provides academic advising to all current students. To look up your advisor's name and contact information, login to your Degreeworks worksheet and locate your advisor in the Student View section or login to your Online Services at www.hcc.edu/myhcc. Students who have earned 12 or more credits at HCC and have a cumulative HCC GPA of 2.5 or higher may register, add and drop classes through Online Services or on campus without a registration code.

COURSE CANCELLATION

Low enrollment can necessitate course cancellation. HCC will attempt to notify students whose class has been cancelled and help them choose another course or obtain a refund. Completing your course registration as early as possible helps the college avoid cancelling classes.

Academic Information

Academic Probation and Dismissal

Academic probation or dismissal for students is determined by the cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) and Quality Hours, as follows:

Cumulative Quality	Cumulative GPA
Hours	Required
Below 9	No minimum
9 - 30	1.75
Above 30	2.0

Probation: The first time a student fails to earn the minimum required GPA as listed above, he/she will be placed on Academic Probation.

Dismissal: At the end of two semesters of probation, if the cumulative GPA remains below the minimum standard, the student will be dismissed. However, the student will not be dismissed if, during a probationary semester, he/she earns a GPA of 2.0 or better.

Readmission: A student dismissed because of the lack of academic progress may petition for readmission by contacting the Academic Affairs office 413.552.2770.

Auditing a Course

Auditing a course means attending but not being responsible for written work such as assignments and tests. Audited courses do not earn credits. If a course requires a prerequisite(s), student must provide evidence of meeting the prerequisite(s). To audit a course, complete an Audit Petition at the Student Records office at the time of registration or within the first week of the semester. The cost to audit a course is the same as enrolling for credit.

Credit by Examination

HCC grants credit for certain Advanced Placement, College-Level Examination Program (CLEP), and DANTES examinations. For more detail on minimum score requirements and credit awards, go to hcc.edu/credit.

Dean's List

Students of superior academic achievement are recognized through the Dean's List. Each time a student accumulates 12 credits, that student is placed on the Dean's List if his/her GPA is 3.2 or higher for that group of 12 credits. Each group of 12 credits is evaluated sequentially; no carryover of credits is allowed.

Developmental Courses

Courses numbered below 100 are developmental and are not applied toward degree requirements. Developmental course credits and grades are not included in credits earned and are not calculated into the Grade Point Average. However, for advising purposes, developmental courses are included in the Academic Standing GPA that is used to determine academic standing (good standing, probation, continued on probation, or dismissed).

Fresh Start Option

Once in a lifetime, after a three-year minimum absence from HCC, a student with a Grade Point Average of less than 2.0 may elect Fresh Start. This eliminates the effect of all past course work from the GPA. Past HCC courses may be accepted into the Fresh Start program in accordance with the college's

After your records are reviewed and all requirements have been met, your name will be placed on the graduation list. Congratulations!

Incomplete Grade

The grade of "I" is given to a student who for good reason (e.g., illness) is unable to complete a major part of the work in a course. It may also be given at midsemester indicating that work has not been completed. The student has until mid-semester of the following semester to complete work for courses **other than**

those that serve as a prerequisite for another course. Unless waived, prerequisite course requirements must be completed before the first day of the following semester/Wintersession. A grade of "F" and 0.00 grade points will be recorded for work not completed as required.

Prerequisites

When enrolling for a course with a prerequisite not taken at HCC, students will be responsible for presenting a college transcript which documents that the prerequisite has been met.

Repeated Courses

Students may repeat courses at HCC in an attempt to earn credit or improve their Grade Point Average. Credit may not be earned twice for a repeated course. All grades, including those in repeated courses, will appear on transcripts. The most recent grade will be included in the student's GPA calculation. The previously recorded grade will be excluded from the GPA, but will still appear on the student transcript.

Financial aid can only pay for one repeat of a previously passed course. This repeat policy applies even if you did not receive financial aid when enrolled in the course in the past.

Transferring Credit Into HCC

The college accepts transfer credit from other regionally accredited institutions of higher learning for courses which may be applied to your declared program of study if the courses are similar in content to those offered here. When transfer credit is awarded, the grades earned are not averaged into your Holyoke Community College GPA. Credit is granted for courses carrying a grade of C- or better, regardless of the cumulative GPA at the previous institution. The college also grants credit for military courses which meet guidelines issued by the American Council on Education (ACE). For foreign transcripts, the college will provide you with a list of agencies that evaluate foreign credentials for a fee; the credit award is based on the evaluation which the college receives directly from the agency and also on the applicability of the course work to your program. The limit of transfer credit from all sources, including CLEP, is in accordance with the college's 30-credit residency requirement. However, you may request a waiver of this requirement by submitting a Request for Exception to Graduation form to the Office of the Vice President for Academic Affairs. Waivers are granted on a case-by-case basis by the Vice President for Academic Affairs.

To submit your transcript for review, contact your previous institution and request that an official transcript be sent directly to the following address: Student Records Office, 303 Homestead Avenue, Holyoke, MA 01040. FAXED transcripts are not accepted.

Veteran/National Guard Benefits

FR 232, 413.552.2265

Eligible veterans, active duty personnel, reservists, disabled veterans, and dependents of deceased or 100% total and permanent disabled veterans may qualify for monthly educational benefit payments from the Veterans Administration. Certain eligible veterans who reside in Massachusetts are also entitled to a tuition waiver for classes. Students with only tuition waivers are responsible for all fees other than tuition. 


