
Black History Month was created to focus attention on the contributions of African Americans to the United States.




Its never too early to ask for help, Set yourself up for Success!

Student Emergency Fund


If you are struggling financially, the President's Student Emergency Fund can help! This fund



assists HCC students who encounter unforeseen financial emergencies that would prevent them from continuing their education.

The COVID-19 pandemic has made these emergencies even more prevalent, but funding is available to help you overcome barriers related to housing, food, utilities, transportation and childcare. The application takes just a few minutes to complete and is reviewed within 48 hours. Students receive the support they need -- or are directed to other resources -- within a few days.
