## Honors 201: 1-3 Credit Project Proposal

**INSTRUCTIONS:** This proposal form is to be completed by the student and the faculty mentor, and is to be submitted to the Honors Program Coordinator (HPC) by the student. Proposals will be reviewed by an interdisciplinary panel, so students should provide the detail needed for faculty outside their proposed field to understand the topic and to provide some basic feedback. Please finalize your proposal with your mentor *before* submitting it to the committee. **That is—your mentor should see your proposal** *before* **the committee does.** 

**PLEASE NOTE:** The Honors Program Coordinator will present the proposal to the Honors Sub-committee for feedback. Meetings are held 3-4 times a semester so the earlier you get your materials in, the better. The Honors Program Coordinator will then provide feedback from the committee to the student and faculty mentor over email within a week of the meeting. If you do not receive an email regarding your proposal, please contact the HPC.
