The U. S. Department of Education allows a college financial aid office to award a dependent student an unsubsidized loan without parent data on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), if the parent(s):

This rule only allows us to award **unsubsidized** loans. A financial aid office cannot award any other type of financial aid (subsidized loans, grant aid, work-study, etc.) to a dependent student who does not have parent data on the FAFSA.

*Biological or adoptive parents. If your parents are unmarried and not living together or are separated or divorced, your FAFSA parent is the parent you lived with more during the 12 months prior to the date you completed the FAFSA. If you did not live with one parent more than another, the FAFSA parent is the parent who provided more financial support during the 12 months prior to the date you completed the FAFSA or during the most recent year that you last received support from a parent.
